## YWCA Metropolitan Chicago Expands Housing Access and Sustainability Services through Acquisition of Partners in Community Building

CHICAGO, ILLINOIS (March 4, 2021)

With housing insecurity on the rise as a result of the pandemic, YWCA Metropolitan Chicago has acquired local housing support organization Partners in Community Building. The integration of these critical services with the YWCA's existing portfolio of comprehensive offerings will benefit individuals and families across the region who are experiencing a range of challenges.

Founded in 2002 by a diverse group of individuals with a shared vision of "community," Partners in Community Building, Inc. has worked to improve the lives of families with low to moderate income through housing and financial support programs. The vital work of Partners in Community Building will continue under the banner of the YWCA's Economic Empowerment Institute, including homebuyer education, foreclosure prevention coaching, and rental assistance.

Building upon the legacy of Partners in Community Building founder and recently retired executive director Bobbi Ball, the housing related services will now be led by Alexandria Cummings, Director of Financial Inclusion.

YWCA Metropolitan Chicago Chief Economic Inclusion Officer and General Counsel Robert Johnson said the acquisition is key to the organization's economic empowerment efforts.



Over the past eight years, YWCA Metropolitan Chicago has transformed from a traditional social service organization to a 21st Century social enterprise committed to building an inclusive marketplace where everyone can thrive. Key to the organization's transformation has been work across the enterprise and the nonprofit sector to create efficiencies, improve access to services and deepen impact through expansion of programs. Some of the YWCA's programmatic expansion has come through acquisition and strategic integration of other direct service and policy organizations including Project HELP, DuPage Early Childhood Collaboration, Voices for Illinois Children, StreetWise, World of Money, YWCA Lake County, and now Partners in Community Building.

Since embarking on this transformation, YWCA Metropolitan Chicago's operating budget has grown from a \$10.5 million in 2013 to an expected \$35 million in 2021.
